What is Griffin Park like?

Griffin Park is rather compact and certainly has an individual feel.

On both sides are single-tiered all-seated stands, while the BIAS Stand (also known as the Ealing Road Terrace) accompanies one end of the stadium.

Away fans are housed in the Brook Road Stand at the opposite end. Opened in 1986, it is a small and unique double-decker stand that has seating on the first tier and terracing below. It is known affectionately by the Brentford fans as the 'Wendy House'.

Food on offer includes a selection of pies, pasties, jumbo hot dogs, burgers and sausage rolls.

Directions

Leaving the M4 at Junction 2, take the A4 going around the Chiswick Roundabout so that you end up coming back on yourself. Continue along the A4 and, at the first roundabout, take a left onto the B455 (Ealing Road). The ground is located about half a mile down this road on your right.

Car parking

There is no parking at the stadium for supporters, although there is a small pay-and-display car park in Layton Road (first right off Ealing Road) which costs £5 for three hours.

Some roads in the area such as Somerset Road (off the A3002 Boston Manor Road) also allow pay-and-display parking for around £6 for three hours, although it can be free after 6.30pm on weekday evenings.

However, there are resident-only parking schemes in operation on some of the roads, so it is important that you pay attention to the small parking information signs.

By train

From Swansea, the journey to London Waterloo takes on average between three-and-a-half and four hours.

Around a five-minute walk from Griffin Park, Brentford is the nearest railway Station and is chiefly served by trains from London Waterloo, which normally has services running every 15 minutes on Saturday afternoons.

To get from the station to the ground, exit onto Station Road. Take the first right into Orchard Road, right again into Windmill Road and then first left into Hamilton Road which leads into New Road and the ground.

Meanwhile, the nearest Underground station is South Ealing, which is on the Piccadilly Line and only a 15-minute walk from the stadium.

Pubs for awayfans

Griffin Park is famous for being the only stadium in England that has a pub at every corner. The surrounding land was formerly owned by the Griffin Brewery, hence the name. These four pubs are; The Griffin (which serves Fullers real ale), The Princess Royal, The Royal Oak (also called the Fourth Corner) and The New Inn, which is generally recommended for away supporters.

Alternatively, it is recommended that you try the Magpie and Crown, which has four real ales on tap and is only a 10-minute walk from the ground.

Hotels

There are a number of hotels within walking distance of Griffin Park including the Urban Villa Hotel and Novotel London Brentford – both of which are a quarter of a mile away.

Alternatively, the Holiday Inn London Brentford Lock and Coach and Horses Hotel are within a mile of the stadium, as is Hilton London Syon Park.

The Kew Gardens Hotel and Clayton Hotel Chiswick are also close by, along with the Abbey Lodge Hotel, Acton Town Hotel and Hotel Xanadu.

Hotels in and around London are generally pricy so be sure to book well in advance.
