#### What is the John Smith's Stadium like?

Opened in 1994 and comprising of a couple of two-tiered and single-tiered stands, the layout of the John Smith's Stadium is rather unorthodox, but one that has landed many design awards over the years.

Unlike at most stadiums, each stand is semi-circular rather than rectangular, and is further enhanced by the large white steel tubing above the contours.

Up to 4,000 away fans are housed in the AbZorb (South) Stand, where you can enjoy fine views of the action while good acoustics make for a decent atmosphere.

Food on offer includes a range of pies, as well as lamb hotpot and vegetable pasties. It is worth noting that, at full-time, catering staff will often sell off any leftover pies for around £1 each, so don't miss out on them!

#### **Directions**

Leaving the M1 at Junction 38, take the A637 before entering the A642 into Huddersfield. As you approach the town centre, turn right at the roundabout onto the A62 Leeds Road and the stadium is just down the road on the right.

#### Car parking

There is a fair-sized car park located at the John Smith's Stadium, where you can leave your vehicle for £6.

Alternatively, it will cost you £5 to park at one of several small businesses along nearby St Andrew's Road.

#### By train

From Swansea, the journey to Huddersfield Railway Station should take around fiveand-a-half hours on average. Thereon, it should take you no more than 15 minutes to walk to the John Smith's Stadium.

Turning past the front of The George Hotel as you exit the station, go straight over the crossroads into Northumberland Street. Then, cross the ring road into Leeds Road before turning right down Gasworks Street. Go straight over another set of crossroads and the ground will be in front of you.

#### Pubs for away fans

Within the vicinity of the stadium, the Gas Club on Gasworks Street and the Yorkshire Rose pub on Leeds Road are recommended options, as is Turnbridge Working Mens Club on St Andrew's Road.

Alternatively, located at the train station are the Head of Steam and King's Head, which is listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide, while you could also try The Corner in the town centre.

#### Hotels

There are several hotels within a mile of the John Smith's Stadium.

The Cambridge Hotel, Huddersfield Central Lodge and The Huddersfield Hotel are all half a mile from the ground, while you could also try the Edgerton Hotel.
