#### **What is the KCOM Stadium like?**

Hull City's home since December 2002, when they moved from Boothferry Park, the KCOM Stadium is set in a parkland and has won several awards for its impressive design.

Three of the stands are single-tiered, while the West Stand has two tiers and is around twice the size of the others.

For night games, the stadium puts on a light show accompanied by music for around five or six minutes before the teams enter the field.

Away fans are located in the North-East corner of the stadium, where up to 2,510 supporters can be housed. The away section extends around the North-East corner into the first couple of blocks of the North Stand.

Food on offer includes burgers and Hollands pies, while you enter the stadium via electronic turnstiles.

#### **Directions**

From the M1, exit at Junction 21A and take the A46 exit to Braunstone Frith / Kirby Muxloe on the B5380.

Then, keep right at the fork, follow the signs for Newark and merge onto the A46.

Follow it past Lincoln and, at the roundabout, take the first exit for Humber Bridge and, on the A15 after about 21 miles, take the third exit for the M180 / Humber Bridge.

Exit at Junction 5 and follow the sign for Hull Airport, before taking the second exit at the roundabout onto the A15 and crossing the Humber Bridge.

At the roundabout, take the third exit (signposted City Centre) and then turn left at the lights and then over the flyover, right at the next lights and the ground is down on the right.

#### **Car parking**

There is a huge car park just outside the stadium, where it costs £5 to leave your vehicle. Although, be prepared for a lengthy getaway after the game.

Alternatively, there is a park and ride facility signposted off the A63, while there are many town centre car parks that are within walking distance of the stadium including the Infirmary and Pryme Street multi-storey, both of which are recommended, as is the housing estate directly opposite the Hull Royal Infirmary hospital, where there is plenty of free street parking available.

**By train**

From Swansea, the journey to Hull Paragon Railway Station takes just under seven hours on average. The stadium is around a 20-minute walk from the station. Turning left at the end of the platform into the bus station, you then walk past Tesco on your right and cross over Park Street at the traffic lights. Following blue pedestrian signs to the stadium, go along Londesborough Street, cross at Argyle Street and onto the pedestrian walkway and bridges over the railway lines to the stadium. For the away end, turn right at the bottom of the steps.

**Pubs for awayfans**

Away supporters have their own bar inside the stadium called the Pitch Side, which shows live sport on several screens while also offering sandwiches. However, be aware that the bar stops serving alcohol 45 minutes before kick-off.

Other recommended pubs near to the stadium include the Park View, which is directly opposite, as well as the Walton Street Social Club and Boot Room.

There are several pubs within a few minutes' walk of the stadium that are designated for home fans only. However, you could try Bowers on Princes Avenue, as well as Avenues on Chanterlands Avenue.

Meanwhile, towards the city centre, recommended pubs on Spring Bank include the Editorial and a Wetherspoons outlet called the Admiral of the Humber. Next door to that is an upstairs bar called the New King Edward, while you could also try The Punch Hotel pub near the Princes Quay shopping centre.

Alternatively, on the edge of the city centre on Albion Street is a small basement bar called the Hop and Vine, which specialises in real ale and cider and also serves bar snacks.

**Hotels**

There are several hotels to choose from within a mile of the stadium including the Vale Apart Hotel, as well as the Carlton and Loud Mouth Count Hotels.

Also, there are chains of Doubletree by Hilton, Holiday Inn Express and Ibis.

Alternatively, you could try the Wassand Arms, Campanile Hotel or the Royal Hotel.

Also within a two-mile radius of the stadium and closer to the city centre are the Kingston Theatre Hotel, Dorchester Hotel and Fiveways Hotel, as well as the Burlington Hotel and Mayfair Hotel.
