What is Kenilworth Road like?

Due to constant talk about moving to a new stadium before finally been granted planning permission in early 2019, any thoughts of investment in Kenilworth Road have been neglected.

As a result, the old ground is beginning to show its age somewhat – most notably in the two-tiered covered Main Stand, which is mostly wooden and dates back to 1922. Up to 1,000 away fans are housed on one side of the Oak Road Stand, with an area of tarpaulin separating the sharing home supporters.

Although leg room is tight, having opposing fans in such close proximity means good acoustics and, therefore, makes for a very good atmosphere.

Directions

Leaving the M1 at Junction 11, take the A505 towards Luton. Continue through one set of traffic lights before turning right into Chaul End Lane. Turn left at the next roundabout onto Hatters Way and the stadium is on your left.

Car parking

Street parking is available within the vicinity of Kenilworth Road, but be sure to avoid residents-only schemes.

Alternatively, it will cost you £5 to park at Beech Hill Conservative Club while, at just £2.80, there is a large multi-storey car park at Luton Railway Station you can use.

By train

From Swansea, the journey to Luton Railway Station should take between four to four-and-a-half hours on average. Thereon, it should take you around 15 minutes to walk to Kenilworth Road.

Exiting the station, go straight across the traffic lights into Mill Street and turn left at the next junction into New Bedford Road. Then, turn right into Collingdon Street and, turning left at the dual carriageway, follow the pedestrian walkway onto the footbridge. As it splits into two, bear right towards Dunstable Road and take the fifth left-hand turn into Oak Road for the visitors' turnstiles.

Pubs for away fans

On nearby Leagrave Road, the Beech Hill Conservative Club welcomes home and away supporters.

Meanwhile, not far from the railway station on High Town Road is the Bricklayers Arms – listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide – and there are a number of pubs in the town centre including a Wetherspoons outlet on Bridge Street called The White House.

Hotels

There are several hotels within a mile of Kenilworth Road – the closest of which is the Quality Skyline Hotel Luton.

Other alternatives include the Leaside Hotel, Stuart Hotel and easyHotel London Luton, as well as Thistle Express London, Luton and the Red Lion Hotel.
