What is The Den like?

The first major football ground to be constructed in London since the Second World War and one of the first to be built following the Taylor Report, The Den is made up of four separate two-tiered stands that are of the same height and look similar.

Away fans are located at one end of the ground in the North Stand (usually in the upper tier only), where around 4,000 supporters can be accommodated. Whilst leg space can be a little cramped, you can enjoy excellent views of the action.

Food on offer includes a selection of pies including steak and ale and chicken and balti, as well as pasties, sausage rolls, burgers and chips.

Directions

There are several ways of getting to the ground but the most straightforward, if not the shortest in distance, is to follow the A2 into London from Junction 2 of the M25. Once you go past New Cross Gate tube station on your right, the ground is about a mile further on. Keep to the right following the signs A2 City/Westminster when the road splits into two at this stage and the ground is on your right.

Car parking

There are no sizeable car parks around the stadium, although street parking can be found on the small estate on your left just past it. Bewary of street parking restrictions and check lampposts for signage. There is also the option of renting a private driveway near the Den via

YourParkingSpace.co.uk.

By train

The nearest railway station is South Bermondsey, which is a few minutes' walk from the stadium. From Swansea, the journey takes between four-and-a-half and five hours on average and requires a change at London Paddington, before taking the tube to London Bridge and a further four-minute connection on the Southern Line.

There is a direct walkway to the stadium specifically built for visiting fans that takes you straight to the away end. Alternatively, if the visiting team brings a sizeable following, there tends to be an 'away fan' football special train laid on from London Bridge to get supporters to the stadium safely.

Pubs for awayfans

It is recommended that you stick to pubs around London Bridge before heading on to the stadium. The Shipwrights Arms on Tooley Street could be worth a visit, as may the Bunch of Grapes pub on St Thomas Street and the Pommeliers Rest on Tower Bridge Road.

On the Borough High Street is the Barrow Boy and Banker, which is a Fullers pub with the benefit of a large screen showing Sky Sports while, further down, the Market Porter is a regular listing in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide with real ales on tap.



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Hotels

The nearest hotel is the Goddis Lodge, which is just under a mile from The Den, while Peckham Rooms Hotel is the same distance away.

There are plenty of options near Tower Bridge including Eurotraveller Hotel and Peckham Lodge, as well as the Victoria Inn, Hour Glass Hotel and Ship Inn.

Chains of DoubleTree by Hilton, Premier Inn, Holiday Inn Express and Novotel are also nearby, while there are endless alternatives further into the centre of London.
